### P. S. OLIPHANT DEAD AT 96.

Pioneer of Niagara County, Who Had  
Lived There More Than 60 Years,  
Passes Away. 1902

LOCKPORT, Feb. 3.—Peter S. Oliphant, aged 96 years, one of the early settlers of Niagara county, and a prominent farmer, died at the home of his son, Silas M. Oliphant. Almost until the last he maintained an interest in the affairs of every day life, and endeavored to keep in touch with the times, at home and abroad. He could read until two years ago, quite well. His reminiscences of the pioneer days in Niagara county were the source of much pleasure to his acquaintances.

Mr. Oliphant was born in Herkimer county in 1805, the year the first settler put up his log hut at Cold Springs, near Lockport on the Indian trail, and later mail route between Lewiston and Canandaigua. He came to this county in 1836, buying a large tract of land in the town of Cambria. It was then covered with forests of immense oaks, hickories, chestnuts and maple. Nearly 200 acres of timber were cleared off by Mr. Oliphant and his son. He took up a study of law and was noted for his trial of cases in justices courts. He never took notes, relying on a brilliant memory which never failed him. The funeral was held yesterday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock from the homestead and a half hour later from the Brick Church.
